Message From Our Chair

FBH Community had another momentous year as we expanded programs to help more children and families in our community. We stepped up after the two hurricanes that devastated our community by immediately holding two food, clothing, diapers, baby formula and cleaning product giveaways in partnership with Halifax Urban Ministries and other organizations, while

serving the families with hot meals sponsored by Jeep Beach. We put families whose homes were flooded in hotel rooms, giving them time to find another residence. When they secured housing, we paid for 6 months of rent, or more, through a generous grant from the **Mossanen Family Foundation**. We hired a builder, through a generous grant by **AdventHealth**, who secured vendors to fix homes of the hurricane victims. Hurricane or disaster relief is not part of our core mission but taking care of families in crisis is part of our overall strategy and we were happy to be able to provide relief, so quickly and efficiently, to the affected families.

Our after-school programs, affected by COVID, are starting again with **Food Brings Hope's** basic premise of concentrating on education, while we take care of the basic needs of our students.

Homes Brings Hope was a recipient of a \$1.5 million from the Florida Legislature thanks to the hard work of Chairman Tom Leek, Bill sponsors Rep. Chase Tramont and Senator Travis Hudson. As the Florida Legislature concentrated on affordable housing, they saw the benefits of funding small organizations which can build affordable houses quickly and efficiently and at much lower cost. We are grateful to House Speaker Paul Renner and Senate President Kathleen Passidomo.

We are blessed to work with 10 amazing partners to impact the lives of families residing in 32114, through **FBH Prosperity**. I am forever grateful to AdventHealth, BCU, Career Source, DCF, DSC, ERAU, Halifax Health, Florida Department of Health, SMA Healthcare and Volusia County Schools.

Our **VCan** team had the busiest year yet, receiving more calls this past year due to the rising rent and food costs, as well as the aftermath of the two major hurricanes. Florida experienced the hottest summer yet with a heat index of over 100 for weeks. With the help of Volusia County's CFAB Funds, we were able to put more families in hotels, to get them out of the hot Florida sun, extending their stays for avg of two weeks. The two weeks of hotel stay would allow them to register with the Homeless Coalition to work toward more permanent shelter.

We are able to step up quickly and effectively due to an amazing team who work hard every day to address community issues affecting families with young children or homeless youth. We are able to do so due to the generosity of our donors and grantors who see the benefits that FBH Community can provide for our community. We are grateful for our tireless volunteers, our visionary Board Members, Homes Bring Hope Advisory Committee Members, VCan Ambassadors and our amazing partners.

Thank you for empowering **FBH Community** to help our community.

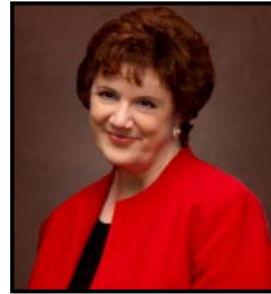

NO KID HUNGRY



In February 2023, FBH Community received a generous grant, for the third year in a row, from **No Kid Hungry**. Through their *“Share Our Strength’s No Kid Hungry Campaign”* FBHC was awarded a grant of \$70,000 to support our critical work to end childhood hunger.



The **No Kid Hungry** grant has enabled FBH Community to serve thousands of families with children by providing healthy food, fresh fruits, vegetables and snacks. We deliver food to families in emergency situations through our **VCAN** program and provide weekly food deliveries to Volusia County Schools which host our **Food Brings Hope** programs. During a year when the grocery prices have soared, more and more families reach out to us for food and baby formulas. **No Kid Hungry** grant has enabled us to provide even more fresh fruits and veggies, meats and various healthy options for families to be able to prepare healthier meals for themselves and their children, creating a healthier community.

PROSPERITY

FBH Community developed Prosperity with the goal to reduce the poverty rate in the 32114-zip code by 10% by 2030.

The Florida Chamber Foundation reports there are over 829,000 children living in poverty in Florida's 963 zip codes, half of which live in just 15% of Florida's zip codes. One of those zip codes is 32114. By focusing on the root causes, we seek to end generational poverty by identifying the hurdles blocking an individual's path to prosperity and partner with local business leaders to provide tailored solutions to those in our program.

VISION

Equip every resident with the necessary knowledge and skills, empowering them to overcome barriers, and build self-sufficiency to become homeowners.

MISSION

Foster economic growth for families by enhancing education, workforce development, employment, health, and homeownership.

FBH Community's Prosperity Initiative is leading a coalition of 32114-partners including: AdventHealth, Bethune Cookman University, CareerSource, Daytona State College, Department of Children and Families HOPE Navigation, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Florida Blue, Halifax Health, SMA Healthcare, Volusia County Department of Health, and Volusia County Schools to provide services and referrals to enhance opportunities for higher education, financial health, career development, and health support. Prosperity works shoulder-to-shoulder with future homeowners to help build a stronger skillset to remove barriers and to advance out of poverty. Throughout 2022-2033, Prosperity served 87 individuals and families in collaboration with our partners using a "community first" approach through wrap-around support and case management.



Prosperity client, Christine, started her year off by setting goals at the "New Year, New You" workshop hosted by UF/IFAS. Christine has increased her credit score by 100 points since starting with the program.

IT'S GO TIME



Prosperity launched a summer financial health workshop series called, *It's Go Time*, in partnership with Synovus Bank and Realty Pros Assured hosted at Daytona State College. The workshops provided an opportunity for clients to gain a deeper understanding of: managing finances, addressing credit repair, building savings, the home loan and buying process in a more personalized way. Upon completion, each participant received a certificate, SkyZone family-pack, and bulk household items of laundry detergent, trash bags, paper towels, and more!

BEAUTIFYING ONE HOME AT A TIME

This Spring, FBH Community was afforded the opportunity to extend its beautification services throughout Daytona Beach. FBH Community was awarded funding by Daytona Beach City Commissioner Quanita May to beautify eighty homes in receiving landscaping and yard clean-up services. This project was implemented to assist citizens who still had debris in their yards from the hurricanes. The bulk of the work included mulching, weeding, planting, and sprinkler repairs. Under the leadership of Homes Bring Hope Building Superintendent, Michael Salles, FBH Community contracted local young adults to provide on-the-job training. Mr. Salles also contracted with locally-owned businesses to provide additional services like pressure washing and tree trimming. The response from the homeowners and community was overwhelmingly positive. One homeowner, Ms. Johnson, who has owned her home for over 34 years, expressed her delight by sharing that the updated landscaping was a tremendous “blessing”.



BEAUTIFYING ONE STREET AT A TIME



FBH Community teamed up with FPL's 'Power to Care' campaign to help make Daytona Beach an even better place to live, work, and raise a family. In partnership with the City of Daytona Beach, FPL volunteers provided a street and park clean-up along Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune Blvd.

REMEMBERING A SPECIAL VOLUNTEER



FBH Community collaborated with Embry-Riddle students for their annual Day of Service in April to bring a fresh look to Midtown in Daytona Beach. VCan launched in 2019 to provide *immediate* hunger and housing relief for children, youth, and young adults in Volusia County. VCan partners with schools, colleges, and non-profits to identify those in need and responds within hours to provide food, temporary shelter, and referrals to local resources. VCan offers a help line that operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days per year. In the fall of 2022, VCan extended its services to meet the needs of those most impacted by Hurricanes Ian and Nicole.



Our box truck, provided by No Kid Hungry, can be seen on the road daily throughout Volusia County delivering food to children and families in need.

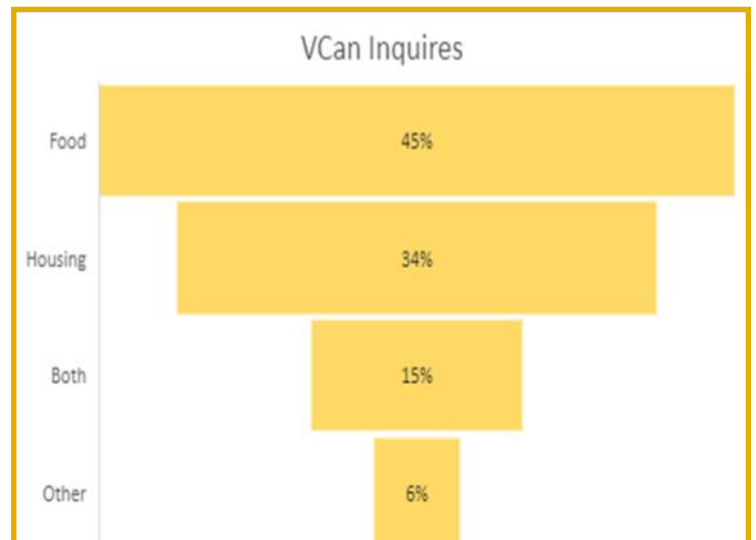

CHILDREN AND FAMILIES ADVISORY BOARD (CFAB)

With support from the Volusia-Flagler Counties Coalition for the Homeless (VFCCH), VCan acquired a Basic Needs Services grant from the Volusia County Children and Families Advisory Board (CFAB). These funds support us in providing emergency hotel assistance to homeless families within Volusia County allowing us to serve more families and continue to fill-in-the-gaps between homelessness and safe shelter.

Since 2019, PRM has helped to keep children off of the streets while VCan and local agencies work on housing solutions.

PRM serves as a vital partner in providing free hotel night stays across Volusia County for children and families until they can move into permanent housing or shelter.



VCan launched a monthly distribution program to provide fresh produce, meats, and pantry staples to approximately 120 households in need of grocery relief. Our community partners and volunteers assist in packing bags and loading groceries into the cars.



HURRICANE RELIEF

Within 48-hours of Hurricane Ian, FBH Community and Jeep Beach partnered to host two Emergency Relief Drives at Campbell Middle School for families impacted by the flooding and damage from the storm. With the support of many local leaders, dignitaries, churches, first responders, non-profits, and volunteers we were able to provide much needed support to 1,096 hungry and displaced families. Both drives provided clothing and shoes donated by Halifax Urban Ministries, hot meals provided by local food trucks and the Daytona Beach Police Department, FEMA application assistance, hygiene products, and household cleaning items. This was truly a whole community effort that FBH Community was proud to lead.



HURRICANE RECOVERY

Through the generosity of the Mossanen Family Foundation, \$250,000 was donated to FBH Community to help repair and rehouse those dislocated by the destructive impacts of Hurricanes Ian and Nicole. In the months following the storm, FBH Community assisted more than 48 families with housing relocation including paying for temporary hotel stays, deposits, and rent for up to six months for those most impacted. With the help of Halifax Health and AdventHealth, a donations drive of new and gently used furniture and household items was organized to help settle the families into their new homes.

A NIGHT TO IMAGINE

VCan partnered with the Volusia Young Professionals Group (VYPG) to raise funds and awareness at "A Night to Imagine" hosted on the rooftop terrace of Brown & Brown. This event highlighted VCan's mission and shed light on the community's need to continue hurricane recovery efforts. One of the most impactful moments of the night was hearing personal testimonies from two Volusia County School employees on the hardships the storms caused for their families and how FBH Community was able to assist both in relocating to safe housing. Event attendees were challenged to raise additional funds to assist families still in need of new beds and bedding. The attendees raised an additional \$2,894 to support this effort. The beds and bedding were delivered to the clients within 24-hours of the event.



FOOD BRINGS HOPE



Food Brings Hope launched in 2007 and continues to serve schools throughout Volusia and Flagler counties to ensure no student goes without food and has the opportunity to enhance in their education. This year, we welcomed Deland Middle School as a new TeenZone program under the supervision of Assistant Principal, Efrain Alejandro, and Coach Kevin Welty. Deland's TeenZone intentionally selected 6th grade students to start and expand each year into the next grade-level. TeenZone students are assigned a staff from the school to serve as a mentor to work with students on learning how to "self-monitor" their academic progress. Mr. Alejandro and Coach Welty also referenced Sean Covey's *7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens* to teach leadership concepts and worked with their students to set quarterly goals for academic growth. We are excited to see what this new year holds for these student leaders!

FBHONORS



FBHonors was established to provide enhanced STEM-focused academic enrichment to low-income, high-achieving students. The sponsors and students attended an end-of-the-year banquet at Red Lobster to celebrate another year of educational excellence. Each student was presented with a certificate and gift, along with recognition for those students who earned the Humanitarian Award for displaying honesty, integrity, responsibility, and commitment to the well-being of others.

CHANGE THE CODE



The Florida Chamber Foundation set a goal for the 32114-zip code to have 100% of 3rd grade students reading on grade level by 2030. FBH Community accepted this challenge and launched **Change the Code** in 2021 at Palm Terrace and Turie T. Small elementary schools. In 2022, Change the Code expanded to Campbell Middle School and Mainland High School. With the help of ACT tutoring, **Change the Code** assisted 29 Mainland seniors in earning their high school diplomas.

CAMPBELL FAMILY NIGHT



Food Brings Hope hosted a Family Night at Campbell Middle School in April along with community partners: AdventHealth, Department of Children and Families, Halifax Health, Daytona Beach Lion's Club, Sky Zone, Volusia County Department of Health, Volusia County Human Services, SMA Healthcare, Fifth Third Bank, and Volusia County Library Services. Over 150 students and their families attended this fun-filled night and received raffle giveaways donated by our partners which included: headphones, games, STEM kits, crockpots, and more! This Family Night provided free eye screenings, diabetes screenings, and immunization shots. Dinner was provided by our friends at Jersey Mike's Subs!

TORTUGAS NIGHT



FBH Community partnered with the Daytona Beach Tortugas to host Food Brings Hope students along with our Prosperity clients and their families for a fun evening of baseball! This end-of-year celebration provided free admission, a dinner buffet, and some hangout time with the team mascot Sheldon. FBH Community recognized the incredible work of Volusia County Schools Transportation by presenting Director, Rodney Smith, with an award to show our appreciation. Jersey Mike's Subs owner, Drew Maider, and his leadership team, was also recognized for raising \$45,000 for Food Brings Hope during their annual Month of Giving fundraiser in March.

TOUR OF HOMES

The annual Tour of Homes was hosted by the ICI Homes Mosaic community. This experiential learning opportunity afforded our TeenZone students insight into the complete process of building and buying a home. Builders and tradesmen from ICI Homes guided the students through the stages of construction showcasing various trades including: electrician, drywall installation, slab and block work, framing, design, and sales. The tour encouraged students to ask questions highlighting alternative paths to successful careers that may not require a traditional college education. Caroline Cline, Lifestyle and Activities Director at Mosaic Neighborhood, hosted the group at the community center with yard activities and a cookout lunch was provided by our friends at Park View Church.



PIERSON FAMILY LITERACY PROGRAM

For the past five years, the Pierson Family Literacy Program located in the San Jose Mission provided a safe place for children to receive homework help and their parents to attend ESOL or GED courses provided by Daytona State College. Throughout the years, the Pierson Program emphasized the importance of providing healthy and culturally-sensitive foods through our partnership with Second Harvest and Farm Share. Approximately 150 families received services each month. At the city's request, the Pierson Program ended in December. FBH Community Director, Mamie Oatis, and devoted volunteers provided an extravagant Hope for the Holidays gathering as one last event to show support of the families and community. Together we shared in the success of the program, students expressed their gratitude to FBH Community and Mrs. Forough Hosseini, kids made crafts, families enjoyed a meal provided by Sodexo, and a special guest read *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*. Each child and their families received gifts. FBH Community is grateful to have been given the opportunity to serve the Pierson community.
