- SMA Healthcare's Supportive Housing Program provides a safe, sober, and supportive living environment for the chronically addicted who are homeless and who are living in unsuitable environments. Because SMA Healthcare's recovery homes operate at capacity most of the time, a referral network has been developed with other supportive housing options in the community.

- Daytona Beach Housing Authority manages several housing programs including Public Housing, HCV (Housing Choice Vouchers, previously Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers), both funded by the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Other housing programs offered include VASH (for veterans) in conjunction with the VA, Workforce Housing, Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) housing and RAD (Rental Assistance Demonstration) program.
- Offers quality housing in our clean, safe and sanitary communities: Maley Apartments, Windsor Apartments, Palmetto Park, The Villages at Halifax, The Villages at Halifax II, Northwood Village, Northwood Village II. Regular REAC inspections of our community properties ensure each property continues to meet our standards.
- The Daytona Beach Housing Authority communities are located near: Bethune Cookman University, Daytona State College, Embry-Riddle University and Daytona International Speedway.

- First Step Shelter's mission is to assist homeless, single adult men and women, who have the potential to stabilize their life and live independently, to move from homelessness to housing. We maximize services and resources, in partnership with fellow community organizations, to reduce homelessness in Volusia County. At First Step we go beyond assessment and temporary shelter by addressing our resident's medical, social, spiritual, mental, occupational, and financial needs. As our residents become stable and self-sufficient, we assist them with the final step of transitioning into housing. First Step Shelter is more than a shelter; we are the path to housing.

- Palmetto House is the largest temporary housing facility in Volusia and Flagler Counties. Its purpose is to facilitate the movement of homeless individuals to permanent housing within a reasonable amount of time (usually 24 months). Temporary housing is primarily designed to serve individuals in accordance with HUD's Office of Community Planning and Development (CPD) programs or functions. Supportive services such as HUD Certified Credit Counseling, Money Management workshop, and permanent housing assistance, are available. Drug screening is mandatory prior to entry and random thereafter. Participants must comply with strict house rules and make progress in meeting their established goals.

Phone calls only to make appointments. Intakes are between 8am-1pm Mon-Fri by APPOINTMENT ONLY.

- **Hope Place** provides emergency housing for up to 3 months for over 100 families with children each year. Families are provided a safe place to stay, day care for children, three 3 meals a day, tutoring, life skills and budgeting classes, and case management. Our Rapid Rehousing Program helps families quickly establish a new residence each year through financial assistance and follows up with case management to increase the chance of a successful outcome, helping families return to being self-sustaining members of our community.
- **Barracks of Hope** provides transitional housing for up to 9 months to male and female veterans who have struggled with homelessness, addiction, and mental health. Single occupancy rooms are provided, along with mental health counseling, case management, and three meals per day. In 2019, Barracks of Hope served 52 veterans and helped move 28 into permanent housing.

Urgent Mental Health and Substance Use Services

SMA Crisis Services 24/7: 1-800-539-4228

- **The Chet Bell Crisis Center** provides stabilization for individuals experiencing mental health and substance abuse crises. Individuals receive medication appropriate to their needs, individual and group counseling, and discharge planning toward the next appropriate level of care. Registered nurses and behavioral health technicians are on duty 24/7, as is a psychiatrist and/or advanced registered nurse practitioner to direct treatment. 24/7 Helpline: 800-539-4228.

- **SMA Crisis Response Team** cares for children, adolescents and young adults ages 25 and under in Volusia and Flagler counties who are feeling depressed, alone, suicidal, or bullied. If you or someone you know is feeling or experiencing any of these issues, they do not have to go through this alone. We can help and are here for them 24/7. We encourage any individual who needs our help to call our Helpline at 800-539-4228.
- **Adult Outpatient Program** provides substance abuse counseling for individuals participating in the DUI, adult and family dependency drug courts in Volusia, Flagler, and Putnam Counties. Family participation in treatment is encouraged, and family education and counsel are provided to support the family in the recovery process. Outpatient services allow the individual to remain active with work, family, and the community while participating in treatment. Call 24/7 at 1-800-539-4228.
- **The Volusia Rape Crisis Center** specializes in advocacy, crisis intervention, trauma counseling and therapy for adolescents and adults who have experienced sexual assault as a primary or secondary victim. This center provides crisis intervention services, assists victims in understanding their rights and options, and offers support throughout the medical and criminal justice process to help the victim and assist in their recovery.
