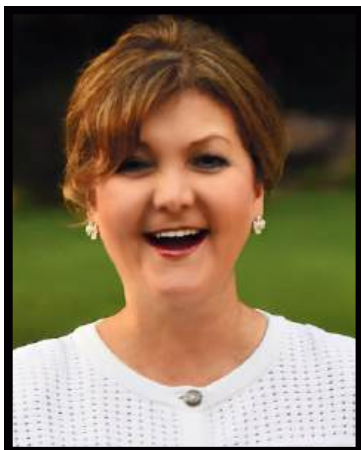

Message From Our Chair



The past year has been a testament to what is possible when compassion meets action. At FBH Community, we continue to advance our mission to eradicate the causes of generational poverty through programs that provide food security, affordable housing, education, and pathways to prosperity.

Through Food Brings Hope, we expanded our reach to serve more students than ever before, providing nutritious meals, academic support, and enrichment opportunities that empower children to thrive in school and beyond. Our KidsZone, TeenZone, and FBHonors programs continue to support students holistically, with proven results of higher scores as compared to the general school population, demonstrating that with support and encouragement, potential knows no boundaries.

Our Lemerand Center of Excellence serves students from Palm Terrace and Turie T. Small elementary schools and the Change the Code program, in its third year of operation, has shown a measurable impact with Mainland High School's graduation rate at a historic high of 95%, helping the school to earn an A for the first time. Additionally, Change the Code program at Campbell Middle School demonstrated that academic support, as well as helping students in other areas of their lives, will impact outcome. These students earned higher reading and math scores as compared to the overall scores at Campbell.

Our Homes Bring Hope initiative has continued to change lives - one family, one home at a time. By building quality, affordable housing and partnering with local governments and donors, we are giving working families the opportunity to achieve stability through homeownership. Each new home represents not just a structure, but a foundation for hope and independence.

VCan continues to transform how we serve individuals and families in need. By responding to clients in need immediately, we are able to provide the necessary help within hours of the request. By partnering with DoorDash, we are able to immediately provide our clients, from different areas of Volusia County, with the food assistance they need. VCan's Fresh Market in the 32114 zip code provides healthy, fresh produce for the families with limited budgets and those who live in a food desert with no grocery stores close by. We look forward to changing the health of our community, one zip code at a time.

The Prosperity Initiative offers opportunities for families to gain financial literacy, job readiness, additional training as it prepares them for homeownership. Prosperity is where our mission evolves from providing assistance to empowering lasting independence.

I am deeply grateful to our donors, partners, volunteers, and staff whose commitment makes this work possible. Together, we are not just addressing need, we are creating lasting change.

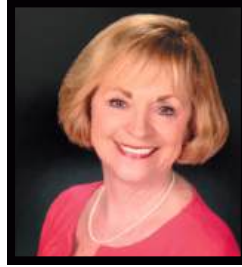

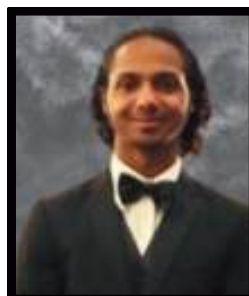

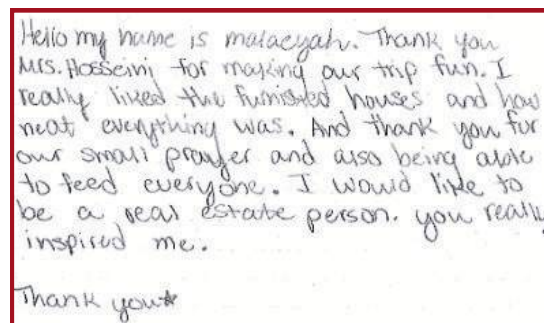

A 32114 Community Initiative

In 2020, the Florida Chamber of Commerce unveiled the Florida 2030 Blueprint to prepare for the continual economic growth of expanding communities and businesses. This initiative focuses on improving educational and workforce opportunities, especially in the most economically challenged areas within the state. One specific area highlighted was the 32114-zip code in Daytona Beach. Since 2007, FBH Community has been actively involved in advancing education, food security, and housing stability in this region. In line with the Blueprint, the Change the Code program supported through a grant from Department of Education for elementary and middle schools, was initiated to provide academic support and enrichment to students attending the four schools located in 32114. Supported by Daytona Beach Mayor Derrick Henry, Mainland High School's program aids seniors in meeting graduation requirements and earning their high school diplomas. Campbell Middle School hosts the Change the Code tutoring program on its campus four mornings a week. The Lemerand Center of Excellence at Daytona State College offers tutoring to students from Palm Terrace Elementary and Turie T. Small Elementary five days a week.

CAMPBELL MIDDLE SCHOOL

The Change the Code (CTC) program at Campbell Middle School, supported through a grant, offered tutoring in ELA and Mathematics to 6th through 8th grade students. It was overseen by Principal Marcia Owens and Food Brings Hope staff. Students were motivated with incentives for attendance and academic progress and received books and STEM kits for home learning. The students were rewarded with a field trip to the Orlando Science Center for hands-on science exploration at the end of the year.

MAINLAND HIGH SCHOOL

The Change the Code initiative at Mainland High School led by Principal Malissa Fraine, supported by Daytona Beach Mayor Derrick Henry, helped 95 students meet graduation requirements through tutoring programs.



LEMERAND CENTER OF EXCELLENCE



Founded in 2023, the Lemerand Center of Excellence (LCE) is an innovative partnership between FBH Community, Volusia County Schools, and Daytona State College, aimed at providing tutoring and enrichment programs for elementary students. LCE offers tutoring in reading, math, and science for 3rd-5th grade students from Palm Terrace and Turie T. Small Elementary Schools. The program includes transportation, meals, and a variety of engaging activities, such as hands-on learning, STEM lessons, and exciting robotics competitions. Additionally, LCE offers family members the chance to explore the College's resources, register for courses, and participate in monthly Family Nights.

Launched in 2019, VCan was established to offer temporary food and shelter assistance to youth under 25, and families with children in Volusia County. Here's how VCan operates:

- Locals can contact the helpline at 386.999.1888 for immediate aid.
- The VCan team customizes food deliveries to suit each client's requirements. For example, families residing in hotel rooms receive hotel-friendly food.
- Through collaboration with community partners, VCan offers referrals to resources like the Department of Children and Families HOPE Navigator, Ms. Renee Richardson, who expedites assistance for families in applying for benefits such as SNAP and Medicaid.
- This year, VCan extended its services to include "Drop the Box" at select FBH schools, "Community Health Nights" hosted at Campbell Middle School and "Client-Choice Pantry" held at the Greater New Zion Church.

VCan operates 24/7 and relies on dedicated volunteers to support its mission.

Florida Blue Foundation Grant / Fresh Market

In October, FBH Community successfully completed the second year of its four-year grant from the Florida Blue Foundation, marking another year of significant progress toward improving community health in the 32114 area. Through this program, which we titled **Healthy Living in 32114**, we distributed more than 14,000 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables to more than 500 families, helping increase access to nutritious foods in what is known as a food desert. In addition to providing fresh produce, participants benefited from health education, cooking and exercise demonstrations, and a sense of community, reinforcing practical steps toward lasting wellness.



Program outcomes were noteworthy: **89%** of regular participants experienced improvements in their health outcomes, and **94%** said they had adopted healthier lifestyle practices.

The program's success inspired the launch of our weekly, new **Fresh Market**, a client-choice market of fresh fruits, vegetables, as well as frozen meats provided by Halifax Urban Ministries. The **Fresh Market** is presented with support from AdventHealth, Truist Bank, and the City of Daytona Beach, and made possible through the ongoing generosity of the Florida Blue Foundation.

FBH Prosperity Paving the Way to Homes Bring Hope with help from HOPE FLORIDA

FBH Prosperity was founded in 2021 as part of the **HOPE FLORIDA – A Pathway to Prosperity** initiative, launched by First Lady Casey DeSantis in collaboration with the Department of Children and Families. Prosperity partners with local organizations in the 32114 area, including Halifax Health, AdventHealth, the Volusia County School District, and nearby colleges and universities. We provide personalized support to employees of these partner organizations, addressing their unique needs such as credit restoration, financial education, and career advancement resources. Our primary mission is to help guide clients toward sustainable homeownership through our Homes Bring Hope program.

S.M.A.R.T. GOALS WORKSHOP

In line with the FL Chamber's 2030 Blueprint for economic growth, FBH Prosperity is dedicated to aiding the state in achieving its goal of reducing poverty by 10% in the 32114-zip code. Financial stability is crucial for owning a home. To assist our clients, we organize regular financial education workshops, such as SMART Goals in collaboration with local financial institutions like Bank of America, Regions and Synovus. These seminars cover a range of topics, aiming to equip clients with valuable knowledge and practical resources to help them overcome financial hurdles and achieve financial independence. When asked, most individuals aspire to lead sustainable, credible, and secure lives within a society that promotes well-being and safeguards fundamental liberties. Prosperity, however, transcends mere wealth; it embodies the concept of enabling every individual to thrive. This is the overarching objective of FBH Community's Prosperity program.

Tears filled my eyes and down my face as I sat and listened to Mrs. Roseanne train. She exemplified and accomplished everything that I desired yet found it difficult to accomplish. You see, I am a single mother of seven, two of which are adopted. I graduated from college earning my Bachelor's Degree and didn't complete my Master's Degree program. I worked hard in my 50 years of life but still haven't owned more than a vehicle. I attended Real Estate School but still need to complete the state exam by June of this year. Mrs. Rosanne was a picture of where I want to be. Everything about her... the love for houses and remodeling, facilitating training with the goal of impacting trainees with a holistic approach to life, money, finance, ownership. The training was AMAZING! I NEED Ms. Roseann to be my mentor. I left the training with confidence needed to continue my journey.

Strong Partnerships Ensure FBH Community's Success

The success of Homes Bring Hope is attributed to establishing strategic partnerships and consistently improving these collaborations as the homebuilding industry progresses. These partnerships grant access to essential resources like financial literacy, first-time homebuyer education, down payment assistance, and closing cost support. By working closely with the City of Daytona Beach, County of Volusia, and various vendors, Homes Bring Hope secures generous donations and discounts, which are then passed on to our families, significantly reducing their home-buying expenses. Through valuable in-kind donations ranging from \$40,000 to \$50,000 for each new home and \$5,000 to \$15,000 for each renovated home, our partners play a crucial role in helping us realize the dream of homeownership for those hardworking families in our community.
